2. Yet, this most baffling of crimes is as old as humanity and shockingly common today. In 1999, 485 children under 5 were murdered and 56.6% of the killings were committed by their parents. Mothers murdered nearly as often as did father, although men are normally far more prone to violence. A mother kills one or more of her children at least once every three days in America, according to Cheryl Meyer, a psychologist and lawyer. The surprising frequency of the crime, known as filicide, only underscores the troubling question: Why would a mother ever kill her child?

Whatever the reason, nearly 50 percent of these women are found to be mentally ill - a much higher frequency of insanity than in other crime.

4. Even when a mother's mental illness doesn't meet the legal definition of insanity, jurors-and the public- are whip-sawed between horror at the act and sympathy for the troubled mother. At one extreme is Marianne Biancuzzo of Tucson, Ariz, age 19, who gave birth to a baby girl in a toilet in her parents'

The official cause of death: drowning. She was found guilty of negligent homicide in 1998 and sentenced to one year in prison, a \$1,200 fine, and three years of probation.

1. Why are there many divorces or at least unhappy marriages?

Sometimes misunderstanding may lead to divorce. Sometimes the difference between the social classes of a wife and husband may lead to divorce etc. When they reach the top of problems, divorce is the solution.

2. What are challenges that couples might face together?

Here we mean the challenges of life. They should understand each other. They should be an understanding wife and an understanding husband. They should be close to each other. They should try to discuss everything frankly to

solve the problems together and to keep their family safe for the sake of the children. Mutual understanding is very important in marital life.



1-According to U.S. Bureau of the Census, 1992, more than 50 percent of all recent U.S. marriages are likely to end in divorce. And even though 50 percent survive, the quality of some of those marriages may be very poor. Many marriages last in which one partner is unhappy; typically, it is the wife who is unhappy than the husband.

A Gallup (1989) poll found that 40 percent of married individuals had considered leaving their parents, 20 percent said they were dissatisfied with their marriages about half the time, and 28 percent had already been divorced at least once.

Why are there so many divorced an unhappy marriages in our society? First, many people had go into marriage with unrealistic expectations about

- it. Second, many marry the wrong person for the wrong reasons. Third. marriage is a very difficult type of relationship, even if one chooses a partner wisely.

- 2. In intact marriages, intimacy and quality often decline over time. Couples face many challenges together, including disagreements over money, difficulties communicating, questions regarding past friendships with the other sex, the complexities of blending two family systems together and dealing with in-laws, sexual relations, the question of whether to have children, and decisions about how to divide household tasks.
 - Intact: complete / healthy and good (سليم)

There is no ideal marriage. Generally speaking, couples face difficulties such as financial problems (one of them could be extravagant), something these difficulties are related to past relations with other sex if one of the partners is jealous. The difficulty of dealing with in-laws and the question of having children or not and the intervention of the families of partners in this issue are also could be one of the difficulties.

In some cases, there is a big problem if one of the partners belongs to a higher class or a middle class and the other belongs to a lower class. This might be a factor which creates an argument between the two partners and the two families at the same time.

Even newly-wed couples face serious problems during the first year of marriage. A study of several hundred newly-wed couples found that 63 percent had serious problems related to their finances, 51 percent had serious doubts about their marriage lasting, 49 percent had significant marital problems, 45 percent were not satisfied with their sexual relationships, 42 percent found marriage harder than they had expected, and 35 percent stated that their partner was often critical of them (Arond & Pauker, 1987).

- 3. Many couples cannot handle the major stressors in married life. They simply are not mature enough, sufficiently committed to the relationship, or creative enough in their problem-solving abilities.

Lederer and Don D, Jackson argued that "both individual experience and statistical surveys make it clear that almost everyone suffers severe disappointment within a few months after marriage." One of the main reasons for this is that the institution of modern marriage is based on many marital myths, or false assumptions about intimate relationships.

Studies indicate that everyone suffers severe disappointment at the beginning of marital life because of depending on myths or false assumptions about marriage.

False assumption number one:

5. False Assumption 1: People marry because they love each other. Many people think they are in love when what they feel is really a strong sex drive, the fear of being alone, or a need for approval from others. It is this romantic "love" that fades with time in many marriages.

The paragraph starts with the first wrong idea and gives us the wrong assumption and after that it gives us the reality and tells us about what happens in real life.

"She is well-respected in her work, and I can always count on her in a crisis."

A more genuine kind of mature love helps ensure a good marriage: "When the satisfaction or the security of another person becomes as significant to one as is one's own satisfaction or security; then the state of love

exists" (Lederer & Jackson, 1968). Marital love is devotion to and respect for one's spouse equal to one's own self-love.

In other words, why do we say that the woman is emotional and the man is strong and all of these stereotypes?!

In fact, both the woman and the man could be similar in terms of their emotions, their feelings, and their actions.

- 9. False Assumption 5: The advent of children automatically improves a difficult or an unfulfilled marriage. Family therapists and researchers generally agree that having children can sorely test even a stable marriage because the couple invests so much time in rearing the children at the expense of their marriage. Some people try to "save" their marriages by having children, but this seldom works.

In fact, having children could cause problems!

Of course, here they are not saying that the married couple should not have children! What they are talking about is that married people should not have children until they have a strong relationship.

10. False Assumption 6: Marriage cures loneliness.

An unhappy marriage may, in fact, produce loneliness. Lederer and Jackson conclude, "Loneliness is better tolerated by those who live alone; they have no expectations and thus, no disappointments. Lonely people who live together have about the same chance of realizing their expectations as the host who

insists that everybody have a good time at his party" (1968).

Couples and family members need to learn to communicate openly and to negotiate in good faith with each other, recognizing that each person is unique and that conflict is necessary and can help facilitate positive change.

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


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
