Parts of a sentence

A subject: is the person or thing that does the action.

> She runs / Ali swims

A verb: is a word that describes an action, occurrence, or a state of being.

- Mark eats his dinner quickly.
- ➤ I am a student.
- > They sell him the tickets.

An object: is a person or a thing that receives the action of the verb

- > He reads a book.
- > He gave his mother a present
- ➤ He lives near the White House.

An adjective: is a word that describes the qualities of nouns.

- ➤ A cool guy/this guy is cool.
- > This guy is cooler than that one.
- ➤ He is the coolest ever.
- ➤ He smells good.

An adverb: is a word that modifies describes a verb he sings loudly, an adjective very tall, another adverb ended too quickly, or even a whole sentence.

- ➤ He smiled warmly.
- > This woman is really pretty.
- ➤ Unfortunately, I was not able to cook dinner.
- ➤ I will see you tomorrow.

Basic sentence patterns:

- 1. Verb
- 2. Subject + verb
- 3. Subject + verb + object
- 4. Subject + verb + adjective
- 5. Subject + verb + adverb
- 6. Subject + verb + noun

Examples:

- 1. Verb
- ➤ Look!
- > Sing.

2. Subject + verb

- Mark reads.
- > She is cleaning.
- ➤ He will study.

3. Subject + verb + object

- ➤ I ate lettuce.
- > She likes her cat.
- > They are buying a car.

4. Subject + verb + adjective

- ➤ I was busy
- > The door is open
- > The dish smells good

5. Subject + verb + adverb

- > She lives here.
- ➤ He drives carefully.
- > People are everywhere.

6. Subject + verb + noun

- > She is my mother.
- You are students.
- My dad is a doctor.
